IMPORTANT NOTES

- All students must take Massasoit's college placement examinations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics and meet all course prerequisites.
- Underage Students (under the age of 16) must also meet criteria under the Youth Learner Policy which includes meeting with a designated school official. (Brockton Campus-Dean of Students; Canton Campus-Vice President; Middleborough Center- Director, and appropriate Division Deans.) See our website for details: www.massasoit.mass.edu.
- Home school students must provide documentation of a home school plan approved by the school district in which they reside.
- Students are responsible for purchasing any books or supplies required for the course.
- Students must complete a high school diploma, GED, HiSET or another state approved high school equivalency program prior to admission to a Massasoit Community College Associate or Certificate program.

Dual Enrollment Program Opportunities for high school students

What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment is an arrangement whereby a high school student enrolls in a college level course and may receive both high school and college credit. There are many benefits for dual enrollment including the opportunity for high school students to get a “head start” on their college credits; take college level classes that may not be offered by their high school; or even take college preparatory classes so that they may be “college ready” by the time they graduate.

What Dual Enrollment Opportunities does Massasoit offer?

Massasoit Community College offers two programs, the Commonwealth Dual Enrollment Partnership (CDEP) and the Massasoit Dual Enrollment Program (MDEP). See descriptions for details and specific admissions criteria for each.

Three Steps for Completing a Dual Enrollment Application

1. Take Massasoit’s placement examinations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. (This should be done prior to submission of the Massasoit Dual Enrollment Application Form and the Registration Form so that students and counselors can choose appropriate classes.)
2. Submit a Massasoit Dual Enrollment Application Form (both sides) with all the required information completed and all appropriate signatures to the Dual Enrollment Coordinator.
3. Submit a completed College Registration Form, (both sides) for the desired semester to the Dual Enrollment Coordinator, Admissions Office.

The Commonwealth Dual Enrollment Partnership (CDEP)

CDEP is a state funded grant which offers a free class to qualified high school students. Priority is given to first-generation college students, students interested in STEM fields (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), minority students, and students who receive free or reduced lunch. Students who may not have had the opportunity to participate in an early college experience due to financial circumstances are encouraged to apply. Students may be eligible for one free class and are selected on a first-come first-served basis. All students must be approved by the Dual Enrollment Coordinator (State funding is limited and approved on a yearly basis). CDEP courses must qualify under the MassTransfer Block or be part of required curriculum under our MassTransfer approved Associate Degree Programs. Students will be enrolled in courses with a minimum of eight students already enrolled. Courses may be taken day, evening, online, or weekend. See www.mass.edu/MassTransfer for details.

Admissions Criteria

1. Student must be currently enrolled in Massachusetts public or non-public schools, including home schools, and be a Massachusetts resident (see note below*).
2. Student must be recommended by a high school guidance counselor or other school official.
3. Student must have a minimum of a 2.5 G.P.A. and be in good academic standing.**
4. Student must have written approval by parent or guardian.
5. Student must take Massasoit’s college placement examinations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics and place out of all developmental courses and meet all course prerequisites. (Contact the Student Assessment Office to schedule a testing appointment, 508-588-9100, ext. 1991), or online at http://www.massasoit.edu/acad/test_assess.cfm.
6. Students must earn both college and high school credit.

Note:

*Students under the age of 16 are required to meet criteria for the Youth Learner Policy. (See website for details).

**Students who do not possess the minimum cumulative GPA may be considered eligible based upon demonstration of their potential for academic success through review by the Dual Enrollment Coordinator. Factors to be considered are steadily improving high school grades, a high class rank, special talent, strong grades in the field of the course, strong recommendations by high school staff, etc.

The Massasoit Community College Dual Enrollment Program (MDEP)

The Massasoit Dual Enrollment Program (MDEP) offers a reduced tuition rate of \$50.00 per credit hour to any high school student who meets the prerequisite for the selected course. The college course may be used for credit at the high school ONLY with the approval from the respective high school. College credit will ONLY be granted if the course is a transferable college level course, approved by the receiving college or institution.

MDEP allows students to enroll in courses with a minimum of eight students already enrolled with the following conditions: Fall and spring semester courses must be scheduled after 4:00pm, Monday through Friday, online or anytime on the weekend. Summer semester courses may be scheduled anytime during the day, evening, online, or weekends. (Note: Courses with enrollments under 12 may be cancelled).

The cost for a three-credit course is \$150.00; the cost for a four-credit course is \$200.00. Students are required to pay for lab or special course fees, books and supplies. Students are limited to two reduced tuition courses per semester. Students must submit paperwork to the Dual Enrollment Coordinator in order to be approved for the reduced tuition courses.

Admissions Criteria

6. High school credit for courses may be granted only if approved by the receiving high school. College credit may be granted only if the course is transferable and approved by the receiving college/institution.
