

Founded in 1966, **Massasoit Community College** offers associate degree programs in arts, sciences, and applied sciences, as well as one-year and short-term certificates for a range of occupations and interests. Corporate and job skills training courses, personal enrichment classes, theater and concert performances, and programs for high school students, younger children, and seniors are among the other offerings available to the residents of Southeastern Massachusetts.

The College has three locations with modern classroom facilities, laboratories, and computer centers:

The **Brockton campus** is a 100-acre facility, with a number of modern academic buildings, a student center, library, two theaters, radio and TV studios, and a field house, which houses a swimming pool, basketball court, and fitness center.

The **Canton campus** is a multi-level facility on 18 acres in the Blue Hills area south of Boston. Specialized labs, art studios, and CAD and Macintosh computer labs support the technical and visual arts programs on campus. The campus is home to the **Veterinary Technology Suite** and the **Akilian Gallery**.

Middleborough Center, fully renovated with smart classrooms and biology lab. The Center is home to the **Emergency Medical Services Educational Suite**, a space devoted to our EMT & Paramedic programs.

The Student Body

Massasoit is one of the largest of the 15 community colleges within the Massachusetts Public Higher Education system. In Fall 2025, there were **6,169 students** (3,452 FTEs) enrolled for credit.

- 62% are female.
- 57% are students of color.
- 46% of students are 21 years or younger; 27% are 22-29; 27% are 30 years of age or older.
- 71% are part-time.
- 48% of credit students are enrolled in career programs; 31% are enrolled in liberal arts and science programs; 22% are non-degree.

The FY2025 annual unduplicated headcount for credit students was 8,898 (3,671 FTEs).

Over 1,500 students annually enroll in non-credit community education or workforce development courses.

Programs of Study

- **Associate degree programs** are offered in more than 40 majors including occupation-specific programs, transfer programs, and liberal arts.
- **Certificate programs** include Dental Assistant, Information Technologies, and Medical Assistant (approved by Mass. Dept. of Higher Education), plus more than one dozen short-term certificates, including Early Childhood Education, Global Learning, Microsoft Office Specialist, Networking, Corrections, Juvenile Justice and Private Security.

2025-2026 Fact Sheet

- Students have the option to select programs that facilitate transfer to a four-year college. Several programs also offer concentrations within the major.
- All occupation-specific programs have employer advisory committees to keep the programs relevant and up to industry standards.
- Courses are offered during the day, evening, and on the weekend. Courses are offered in person, completely online, or as hybrid courses where some onsite attendance is required.

Student Performance on Campus

- More than three quarters (80%) of first-time, full-time fall students return for the spring semester.
- More than three-fifths of first-time, full-time freshmen are either still enrolled at Massasoit (60%) after one year or have transferred (7%) to another college within one year.
- The College's course completion rate is 78%.

Faculty and Staff

- There are currently 98 full-time faculty and 392 part-time faculty.
- There are 246 full-time administrators, professionals, clerical and maintenance workers, and 186 part-time staff.

An Education Affordable for Students

- Tuition and fees for a full-time MA resident student (12 credits, or 4 classes) per semester: **\$2,736**.
- Books per semester for a full-time student (12 credits, or 4 classes): **\$1,440**.
- 74% of first-time, full-time matriculated students receive financial aid.
- Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2025: **\$53,319,326**.

A Partner in the Community

Typically, more than 700 students graduate with an associate degree or certificate each year. The following are graduates disaggregated by program type for the Class of 2025: Liberal Studies & the Arts (27%), Behavioral Science, Public Service & Education (20%), Health Sciences (18%), Business & Entrepreneurial Leadership (20%), STEM (15%).

- About 90% of graduates find employment within one year of graduation.
- More than 45% of graduates continue their education at four-year institutions—most often Bridgewater State University, University of Massachusetts, Stonehill College, and Northeastern University—within one year of graduation.

- The **Corporate & Community Education Division** offers programs that meet the training, cultural, and personal enrichment needs of the College's service areas through a wide variety of job skills training and community education courses. Certificate training programs include EKG Tech, electrician, EMT, Event Planning, Home Inspection, Ophthalmic Assistant, Paralegal, Pharmacy Tech, Real Estate, and Veterinary Assistant. Noncredit courses are offered in the arts, business, computers, finance, education, fitness, hobbies, crafts, personal development, language, travel, sports, recreation, and dance. The Division also offers Adult Basic Education, ESOL, and HiSET/GED Preparation classes.
- Massasoit has **Partnerships** with more than 100 companies and agencies in the area, as well as corporate training programs tailored to assess and meet the individual needs of each organization.
