

#### Theory and Practice



Massasoit Community College's Theatre Arts program is empowering students with a strong foundation in performance and technical theatre, blending theory with immersive, practical experience to prepare participants for both academic transfer and immediate career opportunities.

Students pursuing the Associate in Arts in Theatre Arts engage in a mix of lecture-based and experiential courses, covering acting, voice, movement, stagecraft, and design.

The multi-semester academic path fosters critical thinking, oral communication, text analysis, and intercultural understanding, all aligned with MassTransfer standards for seamless transfer to four-year institutions

The fine-arts hub for theatre remains the Buckley Performing Arts Center, which features two modern theatres, a TV studio, and shared facilities with the Media Arts programs.

The program's hallmark is its Ensembles, including Student Ensemble, Practical Theatre Ensemble, and Dance Ensemble, modeled as a practical theatre collective where students collaborate on script analysis, production design, stage management, and performance under faculty mentorship.

Beyond regular coursework, students participate in the Massasoit Theatre Company, producing a robust lineup of plays and musicals for the college and broader Brockton community.





The program's productions and workshops are open to participants from diverse backgrounds and experience levels, creating a vibrant, intergenerational space where mentorship, mutual support, and creative risk-taking thrive.

Our classes invite both majors and non-majors to participate, building bridges across the campus. This strong sense of community not only strengthens artistic practice but also builds lasting relationships that support students throughout their educational and professional journeys.

#### A Closer Look at What We Have to Offer

Massasoit Revamps Media Arts Program with Powerhouse Facilities, Hands-On Learning, and Community Reach

Massasoit Community College's Media Arts program will be turning heads this year thanks to its robust combination of hands-on learning, industry-grade facilities, and real-world broadcasting opportunities. The associate degree in Media Arts offers two distinct tracks—Video Production and Radio & Podcasting—designed to train students for careers in television, radio, audio, and digital media.

At the heart of the program is the state-of-the-art Digital Media Arts Center, featuring a fully operational broadcast studio, a 40×40-foot soundstage, non-linear editing labs (Avid and Final Cut Pro), audio production facilities, and two radio studios. Students regularly produce original content—from live TV broadcasts to campus event coverage—for the regional Massasoit Channel broadcast on Comcast in surrounding communities







The program includes hands-on certificate options as well: a Video Production Certificate (12 credits) and a Radio & Podcasting Certificate (12 credits), both fully transferable into the associate degree. Students in the Radio & Podcasting route benefit from the historic Dale Dorman Radio Studio, donated by the famed Boston radio personality and complete with signed memorabilia, offering authentic professional experience

Curriculum highlights are:

- · Video Track: Courses such as Broadcast Writing Presentation. Television Studio Production, Advanced TV Production, Digital Video Editing, and a hands-on practicum
- · Radio Track: Classes include Radio Broadcasting, Radio Production & Podcasting, Advanced Podcasting, and practicum opportunities

These immersive experiences prepare students for direct entry into broadcasting roles seamless transfer to four-year institutions via the MassTransfer program.

The program thrives beyond the classroom as well, supported by student-led Radio Club and Media Axis Club, which facilitate station operations and television production projects—enhancing technical skills and building professional networks.

Situated within the 7th largest TV and 10th largest radio market in the U.S., and with over 200 radio and 68 TV stations within driving distance, Massasoit's Media Arts program is strategically placed to launch students into thriving media careers.

The Media Arts program at Massasoit Community College continues to blend academic rigor, hands-on production, and industry engagement. giving students the experience and credentials they need to succeed in today's media landscape.

### Alumni Talks

#### Sabrina Nedder Finds Her Voice On and Off the Stage

For Sabrina Nedder (she/her), a 2024 graduate of Massasoit Community College, theatre isn't just a craft, it's a calling. Hailing from Dedham, MA and now double-majoring in Theatre and Psychology at Salem State University, Sabrina has built a rich and vibrant performance resume rooted deeply in her time at Massasoit.

"I've had the privilege of performing in several shows at Massasoit," Sabrina reflects, naming some of her most cherished roles: Amy in Little Women (2023), Eurydice in Eurydice (2022), and Emilia in Othello (2023). Beyond the mainstage, she also participated in the annual Pride Project (2023, 2024), Practical Theatre Ensemble, and Dance Ensemble. These diverse experiences not only sharpened her skills, but also helped shape her understanding of performance as a collaborative, inclusive, and transformative art form.

When asked what makes the arts at Massasoit unique, Sabrina's answer is immediate: the professors.



"Professor Corinne Mason and Professor Peter Carey live and breathe theatrical passion and channel that passion into everything they do," she says. "I have yet to meet any artists, teachers, or directors more intuitive, caring, and insightful." According to Sabrina, their mentorship provided her with a rock-solid foundation and a clear-eyed understanding of the industry's demands and joys. "Even when discussing difficult aspects of the field, they create a space of safety, inclusion, and joy," she adds.

Sabrina continues to expand her artistry beyond Massasoit. She is currently starring as Janet Weiss in The Rocky Horror Picture Show with Colonial Chorus Players in Reading, MA, running October 10–18. She's also a member of the emBODY Project Ensemble and teaches youth theatre at Summer Stage in Walpole, where she works with children ages 7 to 17.

Don't be afraid to step out of the box.



Her advice for current students? "Don't be afraid to step out of the box. It's okay to be unique and confident in your individualism. Ego will get you nowhere—leave it at the door," she urges. "By doing that, you'll be able to genuinely grow in your craft and fully lean into the joy of creating art."

As for what's next. Sabrina plans to complete her BS in Psychology Theatre Arts in 2026, with the goal continuing both her academic journey and her acting career. Graduate studies Psychology (MS PsyD) are on the horizon—but so more auditions. rehearsals, and roles that challenge and inspire.

Wherever her path leads, it's clear Sabrina Nedder will walk it with courage, artistry, and heart.

Nowhere was this more evident than in Radio Classics Live, the signature live stage and broadcast series he founded, which recreated vintage radio shows and brought together original stars from Hollywood's golden era with local talent and students. Over two decades and 41 productions, Radio Classics Live raised more than a million dollars in scholarship funds for Massasoit students—a testament to Bob's unwavering belief in the power of the arts to transform lives.

Colleagues remember Bob not only for his visionary leadership and his encyclopedic knowledge of old-time radio, but for his compassion, wit, and deep humility. As chair of the Communicative Arts Department, he revitalized the Media Arts program, expanded course offerings, and was a fierce advocate for students.

Though we mourn his loss, we celebrate his legacy. Professor Bowers gave voice to generations of students, brought joy to thousands of audience members, and proved that the airwaves—and the arts—still matter deeply. His echo will be heard for years to come.
