Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Basic

About Our Program

This 172-hour MA accredited certificate program is designed to prepare students to function in the field as pre-hospital care providers. The curriculum follows National Standard Curriculum and meets and/or exceeds the Massachusetts Department of Public Health Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS) requirements. Through classroom and hands-on training, students learn how to manage emergencies in the pre-hospital environment including but not limited to: medical, traumatic, obstetric, psychiatric, pediatric, geriatric, and environmental emergencies. Successful completion allows the student to sit for State of Massachusetts and National Registry of EMTs Emergency Medical Technician certification exams. This is an entry-level program for those who wish a career in Emergency Medical Services (EMS) up to the Paramedic level.

EMS Workshops Tuesdays & Thursdays, 5:30 pm - 7:30 pm & (1) Saturday, from 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm.

EMT Classes Tuesdays & Thursdays, from 5:30 p.m. - 9:30 p.m. & Sundays, from 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Work Readiness on Tuesdays & Thursdays, from 5:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.

Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers on December 10, 2022, from 8:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

In addition to training opportunities, participants may be eligible for a reimbursement to assist with transportation, child care and other incidental costs.



What is the eligibility for this EMT program?

In order to be eligible to take the State/National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (written & skills based) exam, students must meet the following requirements set by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts:

- Be able to read, understand and communicate in English;
- Be 18 years of age;
- Abstain from the abuse of drugs which impair professional judgment and/or practice;
- Be able to lift and carry 125 pounds; and
- Be free of any physical or mental impairment or disease which could reasonably be expected to impair the ability to be an EMT, or which could reasonably be expected to jeopardize the health and safety of the patient;
- The student must also successfully complete the EMT course including 100% attendance.

Please Note: Participants must provide a W9.

Students must possess a high school diploma or equivalent.

Students must successfully complete an intake interview.

All students must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 .
