What is your understanding of the role of a veterinary technician and how has this understanding led you to pursue a career in veterinary technology?	<p>3 = Explanation strongly conveys passion and interest, with specific examples cited that illustrate candidate's desire, interest in, and knowledge of the career of veterinary technology.</p> <p>2 = Explanation conveys passion and interest, with few examples given to illustrate depth of interest in and knowledge of the career of veterinary technology.</p> <p>1 = Explanation weakly conveys passion and interest with examples deficient in illustrating depth of interest in and knowledge of the career of veterinary technology.</p> <p>0 = Explanation gives no examples that illustrate depth of passion, interest, and knowledge of the career of veterinary technology.</p>	Total possible = 3
What experiences have you had that illustrate your ability to provide empathetic and compassionate care to animals?	<p>3 = Well-developed experience(s) cited that strongly and directly illustrate the candidate's empathy and compassion towards animals.</p> <p>2 = Experience cited illustrates the candidate's empathy and compassion towards animals.</p> <p>1 = Candidate writes a cogent statement about why they would be empathetic and compassionate towards animals, but does not provide any examples.</p> <p>0 = Candidate provides little to no evidence showing that they are able to be empathetic and compassionate towards animals.</p>	Total possible = 3
