## Program Notes

The Global Learning Certificate will provide students an interdisciplinary understanding of contemporary global issues while allowing them to partake in study abroad opportunities and engage with the local international community. Enrolled students, who will join a cohort referred to as "Global Scholars," will develop important 21st century skills, including intercultural communication, global awareness, and perspective-taking. They will then learn to apply these skills to contemporary global contexts. The program will provide students with more competitive resumés for the job market, increased scholarship opportunities, and better transfer applications for four-year colleges and universities. All this is accomplished while maintaining adherence to the Core Curriculum and allowing for students to earn a certificate while working toward an associate degree.
The Global Learning Seminar course is a study abroad or local experiential learning project.
