Milestones

After completion of ECED 101 Positive Guidance, ECED 102 Development in Early Childhood Education, ECED 111 Early Childhood Curriculum and one of the following: ECED 105, ECED 112, ECED 217, or ECED 231, students have completed the EEC Lead Teacher Qualifying Courses College-approved Certificate. Students should apply through the ACT Center if not already enrolled.

After completion of ECED 102 Development in Early Childhood, ECED 280 Practicum I in ECE, and ECED 285 Seminar I in ECE, students can apply to the Massachusetts Department of Early Education and Care for Teacher licensure.

Summer and/or Winter Session classes may be available for your program to help you finish on time. See your advisor or visit the online course search for availability.



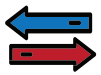
Taking 15 credits/semester or 30 credits/year will help you stay on track to finish your degree in two years.

Program Notes

This program prepares students to work as a teacher in an early childcare setting.

ECED 105 Introduction to Early Childhood Education requires that students complete four two-hour observations of four different types of Early Childhood programs in the community.

ECED 280 Practicum I in Early Childhood Education requires students attend an off-campus student teaching internship on Tuesdays and Thursdays for a minimum of six hours per day. The student internship site is determined by the college based on National Association for the Education of Young Children Accreditation Standards. Students must enroll in ECED 285 Seminar I in Early Childhood Education as a co-requisite.



ECED 111 Early Childhood Curriculum is a pre/co-requisite to ECED 280 Practicum I in Early Childhood Education and ECED 285 Seminar I in Early Childhood Education.

ECED 280 Practicum I in Early Childhood Education and ECED 285 Seminar I in Early Childhood Education are co-requisites so must be taken at the same time.

Some courses may have prerequisites, which are courses that **must** be taken prior to a particular course. For details, log into Degree Works through your MyMassasoit portal.

A minimum of 29 credits and 10 courses is required for completion. The same course may not be used to satisfy two different course requirements.
