Financial Aid

Massasoit offers federal, state, and institutional financial aid to help eligible students cover college expenses such as tuition, fees, books, transportation, and other related costs. Free Community College programs such as MassReconnect and MassEducate are available to all eligible students regardless of income. These programs are not based on financial need and require completion of the FAFSA to be considered.

How to Apply

To be considered for financial aid and Massachusetts' Free Community College programs, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each academic year. We recommend submitting it as early as possible to maximize your eligibility.

Important Notes

If you are not eligible to file a FAFSA due to your immigration status and you meet the criteria of a high school completer under the Massachusetts Tuition Equity Law, you may complete the Massachusetts Application for State Financial Aid (MASFA) to apply for state financial aid, including Massachusetts' Free Community College programs. Most applicants will complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You only need to submit one financial aid application. Do not submit both the FAFSA and the MASFA.
